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Dr. Lan Li received a BA and an MA degree in Chinese Language and Literature from Renmin University of China; a Ph.D. in anthropology from Queen's University, Belfast, UK. She is currently a lecturer in the Institute of for Chinese Studies at the University College of Dublin (UCD), teaching Chinese culture, contemporary Chinese society, international Chinese, and is responsible for teaching and research in both the Institute for Chinese Studies at UCD and the UCD Confucius Institute for Ireland. Dr. Li's research focuses on the popular religion in modern China, the comparison between Chinese and Irish culture, and the localisation and electronification of international Chinese teaching.
